What will you miss the most now that you are fully retired?



Regulatory Updates

<u>Sept. 24, 2021 - College of Pharmacists of BC Board Meeting Highlights</u>

(Not a complete list of topics from the Board Meeting. For the full list, please refer to the link above.)

- Overview of the Continuing Education Audit Process by the College's Quality Assurance Committee (QAC)
- Introduction to the <u>Provincial Prescription</u>
 <u>Management project</u> (PPM), a broad-scale transition to electronic management of prescriptions in PharmaNet, including e-prescribing; aims to integrate community clinical end user systems (EMRs, pharmacy systems) with health authority clinical information systems to support transitions in care between acute and community
- Approved <u>amendments</u> to the Drug Schedules Regulation to improve alignment with National Drug Schedules (NDS) and the Prescription Drug List made under the Food and Drugs Act (Canada), expected to come into force in November 2021
- PPP-66 (Opioid Agonist Treatment) has been amended to repeal outdated provisions related to the transition period. As of October 1, 2021, all pharmacy managers, staff pharmacists, relief pharmacists and pharmacy technicians employed in a community pharmacy that provides pharmacy services related to opioid agonist treatment (OAT) must complete the applicable component(s) of OAT-CAMPP in order to fulfill the College's Opioid Agonist Treatment training requirements
