

**Speaker:** Karen R. Cohen, Ph.D., C. Psych. Chief Executive Officer, Canadian Psychological Association

Dr. Karen Cohen is the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Canadian Psychological Association (CPA), a position she has held since 2008. Dr. Cohen is a psychologist, registered in Ontario. She completed her baccakureate at McGill University and her masters and doctoral degrees in Clinical Psychology at the University of Windsor. She went on to complete a post-doctoral fellowship in rehabilitation psychology and neuro-psychology at the Ottawa Rehabilitation Centre where she worked for 9 years with persons living with a range of chronic health conditions and disabilities.

As CEO of CPA, Dr. Cohen's responsibilities revolve around the association's mandates to promote the science, practice and education of psychology across Canada and internationally. She holds and has held leadership roles on many health and science-related alliances such as the

Health Action Lobby, the Canadian Alliance of Mental Illness and Mental Health, and the Canadian Consortium of Research. She has prepared and presented briefs to standing committees of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada on matters pertaining to health and mental health.

At the invitation of the Minister of Revenue, Dr. Cohen currently serves as co-chair of the Disability Advisory Committee, a committee whose mandate is to advise the Minister on the administration and interpretation of tax measures for persons living with disability. Dr. Cohen has written and presented widely across Canada and internationally on the science, practice and education of psychology and on psychology's contributions to public policy.
