Speaker: Suzanne Solven

Session Title: College Tech Talk 2023

Suzanne has been a pharmacist since 1987. She worked in community pharmacy practice before moving to the provincial government from 1993-2007; became Executive Director of BC PharmaCare; involved in drug policy development of the low cost alternative program, reference pricing, limited drug coverage, special authorization, preferential listings, product listing agreement negotiations and coverage with evidence development. She led the Drug Benefit Committee, was Co-Chair of the National Pharmaceutical Strategy (1st phase) and Chair of the drug plan advisory committee at CADTH. She has led many provincial and national initiatives.

In 2007, she became the Deputy Registrar of the College of Pharmacists of BC and spent 10 years leading the legislation, bylaws, standards and policy development, complaints and discipline

departments.

In 2016, Suzanne moved to Paciifc Blue Cross (PBC) as the Associate Vice President of Audit, Investigations and Quality Assurance, leading the fraud investigation and internal audit branches. At PBC, Suzanne developed and implemented a 5-year Anti-Fraud Strategy that included major transformative change that resulted in PBC becoming a leader in healthcare benefit anti-fraud work. She also restructured and enhanced the Internal Audit branch to assist with ensuring appropriate controls are in place from an enterprise-wide, holistic viewpoint. She was also the Interim Chief Risk officer.

In January 2022, Suzanne came back to the College as the Registrar and CEO where she is very excited to be working with the College Board and staff on the Board strategic priorities to ensure safe and effective pharmacy care for British Columbians.

Session Title: Substance Use - iOAT Clinic Initiatives in Fraser Health

Simran is a Registered Psychiatric Nurse and has completed an Addiction Nursing Fellowship with the BC Centre on Substance Use. She is also the first Fraser Health-sponsored nurse to complete the available training for registered nurse/registered psychiatric nurse Suboxone prescribing for opioid use disorder.

She is currently employed as an MHSU Regional Substance Use Clinical Nurse Educator with Fraser Health. Some of her current work include: Addiction medicine / substance use training for acute/community nurses, creating policies, procedures and pre-printed orders for opioid and alcohol use disorder, supporting the Managed Alcohol Program, standardization of Rapid Access Addictions Clinics, and providing COVID-19 IPC support for the vulnerable population in Surrey, BC. Her past work experience includes working in the Fraser Health Inpatient Detox Withdrawal Management Centre as well as Surrey's Rapid Access Addictions Clinic (RAAC).

Speaker: Sean Reid Session Title: Substance Use - iOAT Clinic Initiatives in Fraser Health

Sean first stepped into nursing in 2005 as an LPN where he worked at Surrey Memorial Hospital in many units, including palliative, medicine, oncology, respiratory, and rehabilitation. He obtained his BSc in Nursing in 2011 and went back to medicine for a short time before taking the BCIT Critical Care course and pursuing Emergency for 9 years. In 2021 he ventured into community health as a nurse coordinator for the Fraser Health Regional MAID program, then transitioned into the Mental Health and Substance Use (MHSU) pathway. He is currently the coordinator for five opioid agonist

therapy (OAT) regional programs, a Rapid Access Addictions Clinic (RAAC) program, and the Injectable Opioid Agonist Therapy (iOAT) program.

Outside of work, he is the father to three sons and one daughter, and husband to this amazing wife Angie. In his free time, the entire family is active in community athletics, especially lacrosse.
